
The Club AGM was held on Thursday 10th November and the following were elected as Committee Members for the next year:-



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DELAYED SURFACE MARKER BUOYS

As Diving Officer, it has been brought to my attention that some buddy pairs are diving with only one D.S.M.B between them.

This is unacceptable because British waters are not renowned for good visibility and it is not unusual for a pair of divers to become separated. If this occurs and you only have one DSMB it leaves one of the pair having to surface without a D.S.M.B.

This makes it very difficult for our dive boat skipper to spot you when you surface. More importantly, because there is a lot of boat traffic around our coast there is the real danger of being hit by some other boat. The skipper of which stands little or no chance of seeing your black head bobbing about on the surface.

Propellers make a real mess of divers.

You only need to deploy one D.S.M.B per pair of divers but, for your own safety, everyone should carry a D.S.M.B at all times in case you get separated. That way you have every chance of being safe and of getting picked up, especially if you have drifted away from the main group. As a club, our aim is to make diving as safe as possible so:

BE SAFE AND BE SEEN AT SEA.

So far 41 garments have been purchased since sales began at the end of August.



Buoyancy and trim workshop by Lynne Bunker

On a fairly cold Saturday, six intrepid members of our club set off early to be at <u>Dosthill Quarry</u> for an 8:30 start. Dosthill proved much quicker to get to than originally thought, and the earlier than planned for arrival gave us a chance to have a quick look at the diving site that lay ahead. It reminded me a little of Cromhall (portaloos) but a lot more compact! Having been on previous BSAC courses where you are lucky to get 15 minutes to eat and get ready to dive, we proceeded to assemble our kit, however we were treated to 30 minutes to eat and 30 minutes to be ready to dive—wow!

The day started with some lectures at the nearby Church Hall, complete with outside (cold) loos, but the ample teas and coffees helped! Before long we were heading off to do some diving. We were in groups of 3, with surface support too.

The first dive enabled everyone's current weight to be checked out and various exercises were undertaken, before moving onto a shotline, and undergoing exercises and stops commencing from around 15m, and various stops on the way up. Individual advice was given, particularly in relation to shedding ankle weights.

After a bit of a break it was assessment time, so in we went again, this time to 12m. Various stops later and assessments complete... time for the results. Between us, we saw our club proud, with Gold (±50 cm, the standard expected for Dive Leaders and Open Water Instructors) being awarded to Paul Nash, Dan Rowe and Jamie Wolstencroft, and Black (the highest standard, ±30cm, expected for Advanced and technical divers) awarded to Lynne Bunker, Chris Hastie and Sophie Hastie. I think it is fair to say that we all enjoyed ourselves and learnt a lot from the course.

This course is essential for anyone considering any technical diving, but aimed at all levels. It is really good to provide a focus for buoyancy and trim, in a great environment. It is one of those courses that every diver should make the effort to attend. The next one is 10 December (same night as our Dinner), but we were away in good time and home by 16:15!

As tasked by the course instructors I will be going to Stoney Cove on Sunday 4 December, so that those who were on the course can practice what has been suggested, but also other club members who wish to explore their buoyancy/trim have the opportunity to do so, after all, it is this effort that makes us better divers. Please let me know if you want to come

MEMBERSHIP FEES 2016

To the Stratford Branch, all Members pay an annual subscription of £118 towards costs of the Branch. To BSAC, Members pay an annual subscription of £56.50 that covers BSAC costs, their monthly 'Scuba' magazine and their third party insurance. Both of the above are due on the 1st April each year.

New members are required to pay a full annual subscription for both of the above when they join. In their second year they pay pro-rata to bring them to the next 1st April.

Hire of kit for a new trainee is £60 for a period of for four months. Thereafter it is £30 per month.

Pool Sessions - £3 for all Members Try a Dive £15 a session. £10 of this is refundable when you join the club. Training Books vary but typically

the cost for an Ocean Diver is £45.

The Club has 2 boats (RIB's) and the Committee believes that Members should contribute towards the cost of running these boats in proportion to how often they dive from them. This is paid for by a compulsory Annual Boat Levy of £30 payable along with your Annual Subscription by all Members in their second year onwards If you do minimal diving from the Club boats during the year you will receive a full or part refund of your Boat Levy. Non members diving from Club RIBs will pay £10

Members towing RIB's get a minimum of 60 pence per mile

per dive.

CLUB DIVING STANDARDS

All Members are expected to dive in accordance with the guidelines of the BSAC as published from time to time.

No dives should be organised without the prior approval of the Diving Officer who will provide you with a Diving Log which is to be completed with details of the dive and returned to him.

On the reverse side of the Diving Log is a list of the main BSAC guidelines that the Committee wishes to emphasise at this time.

You are reminded that the depth limits for qualified divers is as follows:

Ocean Divers – 20 metres

Sports Divers – 35 metres

All other qualified divers -50 metres

Members who ignore any of these guidelines do so entirely at their own risk.

You are also reminded of the following:

- Members are strongly recommended to use Delayed Surface Marker Buoys which can be filled by means other than purged air from a mouthpiece.
- Sports Divers and above are recommended to carry their own independent source of back-up air in a second cylinder (twin or pony)

These extracts are not exhaustive and so if you have any queries you should clear these with the Diving Officer before diving.
